

MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE ASSEMBLY OF THE BAPTIST UNION OF VICTORIA

Held at Reggio Calabria, Brunswick 476 Brunswick Rd, Parkville VIC 3055 20 October 2023

1. WELCOME, PRAYER AND WORSHIP

Union Council Chair, Mick Turnbull opened the meeting with a word of welcome and an acknowledgement of Country. Mick shared the scripture from Philippians 2:1-11. (NIV) and prayed for the meeting. Worship was led by Zomi Baptist Church Victoria worship team.

Debbie gave an overview of the 2023 forecast as follows:



5 PANEL – 2023 UK STUDY TOUR

Rev. Daniel Bullock facilitated discussion among the panel members:

Each panellist spoke about their UK trip experience and some of the key takeaways such as hospitality being a vital point of difference for our churches and their communities. Investing in the community by creating a space for people from all walks of life to come together to pray and reflect. Making wellbeing a focus as it can often be forgotten about. Making a conscious effort to take care of ourselves, will naturally flow into other parts of the church and community. The key take-aways were presented as follows:

Key takeaways

- Hospitality is vital
- Invest in community
- Wellbeing needs to be a focus
- Small or Large it does not matter. Give it a crack
- Leadership pipelines for church planting and existing churches
- Prioritise Incarnation and relationships
- Evangelism needs explanation / definition

 How are we, the church good news in the neighborhoods? As a disciple of Jesus, how am I good news to the people in my life?

6 VISION CASTING 2024

Rev. Daniel Bullock shared the 2023 BUV research insights/summary with the Assembly.

The overall research indicated that our churches and BUV are aligned with what the core priority of Mission.

The Flourishing Church Survey results indicated that our churches rated flourishing in spirituality, congregational engagement, structure, and process over 80%. The areas with a low percentage of churches reporting flourishing results were in evangelism, justice and leadership.

Overall, the research results suggested that despite signs of a general a lack of hope within the wider community, with specific fears such as cost of living and mental health and anxiety, our churches are well placed to provide the right support to for the communities' wellbeing into the future. Survey results were presented as follows:

Research Summary

- Improved state compared to last few years
- Alignment on our core priority mission
- Flourishing Church Survey results indicate:

- over 80% churches rated flourishing in Spirituality, Congregational Engagement and Structure and Processes

- Areas with lowest % of churches reporting flourishing results were Evangelism, Justice and Leadership

 Mission, outreach and Evangelism clearly provide challenges or churches -Resources and training requested


Research Summary

- Congregation sentiments positivity, hope, enthusiasm, cautious optimism / anticipation
- Leaders more positive and excited but still times of exhaustion
- Churches mostly seen increase in total attendance, some balanced by decrease in frequency of attendance
- Churches making changes to stay relevant more outward focus, prayer
- Wider community pain points lack of hope, rising costs, mental health anxiety
- Overall churches are well placed to provide support to community wellbeing into the future

Daniel spoke about the BUV support hub's priorities in relation to the 4 strategic focus areas being Mission, Leadership, Relationship and Health:

MISSION

- Promote an active concern for the wellbeing of society
- Resource and encourage churches to 'Be and share the good news of Jesus'
- Develop comprehensive church planting strategy for the next 10 years




Daniel talked about an initiative to fund church planting with partners, giving emphasis to 'a lot of people giving a little makes a remarkable difference'. Daniel emphasised the importance of planning for the future Baptist movement through Church Planting. The goal is to have 1000 partners in 2024. Daniel encouraged members of Assembly to scan the QR code that will provide the link to the information on how be become a partner in Church Planting. He encouraged everyone to take part in becoming a partner; from as little as \$2 per week, one can be a part of advancing God's Kingdom together.



9 CELEBRATIONS

Rev. Daniel Bullock presented a video regarding the Baptist Schools' Centenaries and facilitated a dialogue regarding the Community of Transfiguration's 50-year anniversary.

10 GOOD NEWS STORIES AROUND THE BUV

Rev Daniel Bullock facilitated an invitation for members of Assembly to share some good news stories from their community/ church or agency. Some of these stories were:

- This attendee returned to their hometown after being away for some time. During her visit she was reminded of her years as a student at a Baptist School. Upon reflection she felt grateful for the values that she learnt while being there.
- A member was approached by an atheist and was asked for a prayer. She was feeling sad, lonely, depressed, and lost and was in real need of some pastoral care and guidance. They talked and prayed together, and as a result from that day she is now a converted Christian and is a dedicated member of the Church.

- A regular face that attends the food centre at Dandenong BC attended one day and announced that he wanted to say a prayer. The church members weren't sure what to expect as this person can sometime be unpredictable with the things he says. In that prayer he shared that it was his late mother's birthday, a figure that was important and personal for him, and he thanked the Church for taking care of him and always keeping him in their prayers. The church was pleased and felt great encouragement to see the positive impact they have had in his life.
- A Sri Lankan refugee left behind his wife and son to move to Australia. When he arrived, he was detained in a refugee camp for 6 years. After leaving the camp he resided in a granny flat behind the main house of a Church member for 7 years. He was reunited with his son and recently was offered a scholarship at one of our BUV schools. He is now in the process of bringing his wife to Australia.
- Tiny Turtle's Playgroup has been operating successfully for 25 years. They continue to reach out to the community with positive feedback from parents.
- In the city, the homeless rates have increased post Covid. 29 young people have lost their lives from overdosing as of late. The city churches have become a central part of the conversation in the city with regards to how we can respond to this epidemic. The churches have been sought after for pastoral care which is a blessing.
